**PUBLIC INPUT SOUGHT ON LONG-TERM SOLUTIONS TO  
BAY-DELTA SYSTEM PROBLEMS**

Building on the recent agreement on water quality standards for the Bay-Delta, state and federal agencies with management and regulatory responsibilities in the San Francisco/San Joaquin Bay-Delta system are continuing their cooperation in an important new program. The purpose of the joint CALFED Bay-Delta Program is to stabilize, protect, restore, and enhance the Bay-Delta system. The program will develop a long-term comprehensive and balanced plan that addresses the resource problems facing the Bay-Delta system, including:

- Ecosystem Quality
- Water Quality
- Water Supply Reliability
- Vulnerability of Bay-Delta System Functions.

Public input is needed for the program to achieve success. A series of public meetings has been scheduled by the CALFED Bay-Delta Program to involve and inform the public about the important Bay-Delta system planning activities, to help define Bay-Delta system problems, and to help develop a range of solution alternatives. The public meetings highlight CALFED Bay-Delta Program activities, including results from recent public workshops, at which problems facing the Bay-Delta system were discussed and preliminary program objectives were reviewed. The public meetings provide an opportunity for comment and suggestions as we develop an initial set of solution alternatives. The next meeting will be held on:
