WHY ACTIONS IN THE BAY-DELTA SYSTEM AFFECT YOU

The Bay-Delta System is a Critical Resource for the Entire State of California

The San Francisco Bay / Sacramento-San Joaquin River Delta is a critically important part of California's natural environment and economy.

- A multi-million dollar commercial and sports fishery industry is supported by four runs of chinook salmon which spawn in the Sacramento River, the San Joaquin River, and their tributaries.
- The Bay-Delta system is a unique habitat for more than 120 species of fish, and provides a winter haven for a large percentage of birds on the Pacific Flyway.
- State and federal water projects deliver water for 4.5 million acres of farmland and use by 20 million residents throughout California.
- Issues regarding the millions of acre feet of Northern California water which move through the Bay-Delta system need high priority consideration and management decisions.

The CALFED Bay-Delta Program was created by state and federal agencies to work together to stabilize, protect, restore, and enhance the Bay-Delta system. Through as much public involvement as possible, a comprehensive and balanced plan is being developed to address the Bay-Delta system resource problems which affect all of California.

To keep you informed of this process, a series of public meetings has been scheduled throughout the state. These meetings are intended to involve and inform you about Bay-Delta system planning activities. These meetings also give you an opportunity to comment and make suggestions as we develop the CALFED Bay-Delta Program. We encourage you to attend one of the scheduled public meetings to discuss solutions to Bay-Delta system problems affecting California.

Public Meetings Schedule

A series of public meetings has been scheduled throughout the state to encourage your involvement and participation in this process. At these meetings we will discuss a general overview of the CALFED Bay-Delta Program with specific attention upon:

- Ecosystem Quality
- Water Quality
- Water Supply Reliability
- Vulnerability of Bay-Delta System Functions
