The Bay-Delta, an intricate web of waterways created at the junction of the San Francisco Bay and the Sacramento and San Joaquin rivers, is a critically important part of California's natural environment and economy. It supplies drinking water for more than 22 million Californians, irrigation water for more than 4 million acres of the world's most productive farmland, and supports 120 fish and wildlife species; some found nowhere else on the planet.



In January, CALFED will release its draft preferred alternative for a Bay-Delta solution.
