Dear Executive Director Snow:

Please consider yet another alternative for CalFed. This alternative not yet included in the draft plan would rely more heavily on conservation of water and efficiency of delivery to provide high quality water for people and wildlife rather than on new and enlarged dams and storage reservoirs.

A program that emphasizes conservation and efficiency of delivery would restore and protect our watersheds and groundwater basins for high-quality, reliable water for people and wildlife; maximize water efficiency; restore California's fish, birds, wetlands, rivers, deltas and bays; and provide economic incentives for efficient water use.

We Californians already know that continuing to develop and deliver water in the same way we have done since civil engineers began reshaping natural water systems is a mistake.

Rather than continue our previous mistakes in water development and delivery, we can use our immense technological capacity to construct a new more efficient system.
