As per our conversation Tuesday evening after the Lodi Scoping session for Folsom South Canal Connection (NOP Alternative), I am sending you a copy of the San Joaquin County's Farm Bureau President's remarks in the Jan 17th, Farm Bureau Publication. **WATER SUPPLY IMPROVEMENTS**

I would like to submit these remarks as an indication of the "grass roots" feelings of the Lodi-East Side- property owners who must lower their turbine pumps & increase Motor Horsepower every 10 years as the U. G. water table recedes.

While we understand it is not your (EBMD's) problem, for the past year we felt the Utility actually wanted to be a partner in a mutually beneficial Ground Water Management Plan.

As a long time resident & former E/S Property owner I would again ask you- " Are we to assume that the proposed 120" U.G. Pipeline Connection at Grant Line Road turn-out (from Folsom So. Canal) is the preferred route & method of transporting your American River Water to the Mokelumne Aqueduct?

I would like to see the Utility give the Farm Bureau Members some assurance that this is not a closed issue.
