Setting: Meeting at MWD

I met with Paul Teigen, Bob Harding, Wyatt Won and Brent Walthall with Metropolitan Water District of Southern California to discussed CALFED's conjunctive use program and the current MWD conjunctive use programs.

Paul discussed the Integrated Resource Planning (IRP) process that MWD undertook in 1993 to balance risk versus cost in its programs. We discussed the value of IRP and the similarities to the CALFED process.

We then discussed some of the conjunctive use programs MWD is implementing or considering, including:

- Calleguas Municipal Water District (30 aquifer storage and recovery wells)
- Raymond Basin (nine ASR wells to be constructed to extract 25,000 acre-feet per year)
- Central and West Basin (last contract was one year ago)
- Semitropic (goal is to provide sufficient money in early years to pay for facilities)
- Chino Basin (500,000 to 1 million acre-feet of dewatered storage, although many people are opposed to have MWD in the basin)
- Madera Ranch (MWD has not looked at seriously)
- Main San Gabriel Basin (75,000 acre-feet of storage capacity, although there are considerable water quality and political issues).

MWD believes that \$300 per acre foot is the maximum present value for storage program and \$150 per acre foot outside of their service area.

I then discussed the status of CALFED's groundwater program, including some of the principles for implementation. We agreed to meet again to discuss more specific opportunities for CALFED to help implement south of Delta groundwater storage.
