Subject: Conversation with Ted Roefs, USBR

At the October 1, 1997 meeting of the Water Quality Technical Group it was announced that I would be participating on the team developing the Preferred Alternative. In that context, Ted Roefs said he felt there was additional information that should be fed into the decision making process. There was not an opportunity at this meeting to discuss the matter in detail, so it was deferred. This morning I called Ted, and these are the pieces of information that he believes are needed:

1. Model runs for Alternatives 3A and 3B that depict salinity projections at Old River at Tracy Pumping Plant.
2. DSM1 particle tracking study to depict bromide sources to the Delta. (I mentioned to Ted that MWD staff have been doing work along these lines) *Sent Chris Waring's stuff to Ted by mail.*
3. In the M&I and Agricultural economic analyses appearing in draft technical appendices, it is stated that costs of the alternatives to these interests is unknown. Ted believes the document should indicate current costs of agricultural and M&I water supplies to users and compare these costs with estimates of costs that would have to be borne by these users for implementing the alternatives.

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
