- Need to display the consequences of new actions v. historical biological situation.
- Dry year flows and outflow were not improved, plus exports were increased.
- Ground water was not used in dry years.
- Dry year use of expanded Banks is scary.
- Not using expanded Banks in wet winters; instead using it April to June period (1993).
