Summary of Technical Team Reports Stressors and Example Restoration Actions

The attached table summarizes information from the technical teams who have been working with the CALFED Bay-Delta Program on near-term funding needs and priorities. The table provides examples of actions, as suggested by the technical teams for different geographic areas, to address the stressors and the 1997 priority species and habitats. Several important points should be emphasized about this summary:

- The stressors and example restoration actions identified by the technical teams are not all of equal biological and ecological significance.
- The example restoration actions listed in the Summary are only examples. There are likely other types of actions which could effectively address the stressors. Proposals are encouraged for any actions which address priority species and habitats, even if the actions are not listed in the Summary.
- The geographical areas listed in the Summary are only examples. Some example actions could also be effective in addressing a stressor in a different geographical area.
- The technical teams identified restoration actions not considering the specific constraints of individual funding sources. As a result the technical teams identified actions that are outside of the scope of this 1997 Category III RFP. CALFED evaluated the restoration actions to determine which example actions were consistent with the Category III program for 1997. A column in the Summary indicates if the example action is generally consistent with 1997 Category III funding.
