Subject: Habitat Restoration Coordination Activities

The CALFED agencies, during the past six months, have been evaluating two important issues with respect to current ecosystem restoration activities. The first was developing a better internal coordination mechanism for existing state and federal habitat restoration programs. The primary purpose is to achieve greater ecosystem results from coordination and cooperation within existing funding sources. The second issue involves the integration of the Category III Program (the non-flow environmental improvements contained in the Bay-Delta Accord) into the other habitat restoration efforts.

Recognizing that the CALFED Bay-Delta Program and BDAC are in the process of developing a long-term vision and program to achieve restoration of ecosystem health, CALFED has proposed that such a coordination and integration effort be initially established under the CALFED Bay-Delta Program. This effort, while geared to implementation of existing programs on an on-going basis, must be developed to not only be consistent with the long-term objectives, but also to begin basic implementation of habitat programs.

In order to accomplish the type of coordination and integration necessary, the CALFED Bay-Delta Program is proceeding with recruitment of a Restoration Coordinator and development of a stakeholder/ecosystem roundtable. The Coordinator will have the responsibility of working with the managers of existing restoration programs and the broad interest community to develop annual strategies to achieve the greatest benefit with existing programs. The Ecosystem Roundtable will provide vital stakeholder collaboration on the strategic and practical issues necessary for effective habitat restoration.

To further ensure proper integration of the long-term efforts into the near-term restoration strategies and practical restoration issues into the long-term program, the Ecosystem Roundtable composed of non-BDAC members is being established as a subcommittee of the Bay-Delta Advisory Council and therefore under the original Federal



Notes:

1. Position is responsible for coordinating state/federal and other (Category III) restoration activities to optimize ecosystem health improvements.
2. This position and activity will initially be a unit within the Bay-Delta Program and will likely transition to a separate, long-term CALFED function.
3. Roundtable provides a formal policy/technical role for stakeholders in restoration priority setting and decision making.
4. Roundtable will most likely be established as a subgroup of BDAC but could transition to a separate FACA charter or other structure.
5. Functional Groups will include agency and stakeholder technical experts and will initially rely on existing groups such as Restoration Roundtable, Four Pumps, Salmon Stamp, IEP, etc.
