Subject: Leads on Restoration Coordination Program Tasks

Now that there are two of us again, we have split the tasks in the Restoration Coordination Program between us. Whenever possible, please contact the person who is the lead.

Kate Hansel will have the lead on the following activities:

1. Project Management
These are the tasks involved with implementing previously selected projects including oversight on contract preparation and implementation.
2. Coordination with other funding sources
Working with CVPIA and other funding programs to ensure that planning and implementation of restoration projects is coordinated to maximize efficiency. This set of tasks will require close coordination with the project selection tasks assigned to Cindy.
3. Permit coordination
These tasks include those necessary to efficiently obtain regulatory permits for selected projects and provide the benefit of these experiences to other parts of the program working on any long-term measures to improve permit coordination.
4. Coordination with Assurances and Finance Workgroups and with Watershed Program.
5. Lead on preparation of Restoration Coordination Program packets to BDAC, CALFED Management Team and Policy Team.

1. Project selection and funding cycle

These tasks are those involved with review and updating of priorities, identification of areas requiring funding and selection of projects to be funded. This work will be done in cooperation with staff working on the Ecosystem Restoration Program Plan and the Conservation Strategy in the Habitat Conservation Plan. These tasks include working with technical panels and other scientific advisors as well as developing grant solicitation packages or directed programs.

2. Monitoring program development and implementation

These tasks are those associated with development of monitoring procedures for restoration projects as part of the Comprehensive Monitoring, Assessment, Reporting and Research Program.

3. Coordination with ERPP, Water Quality technical team.

4. Lead on preparation of packet for Ecosystem Roundtable.
