## **RESTORATION COORDINATOR**

**PROGRAM:** The CALFED Bay-Delta Program is charged with coordinating the development of long-term solutions with respect to environmental protection and water supply dependability in the San Francisco Bay, Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta Estuary and its watershed. The development of these long-term solutions involves the establishment of a comprehensive program for coordination and communication between Federal and State agencies with responsibilities for implementing water policy (CALFED).

**DUTIES:** Under the direction of the CALFED Bay-Delta Program Executive Director, the Restoration Coordinator will be responsible for facilitating coordination of state, federal, and other restoration activities. The Coordinator will be responsible for convening program work groups (composed of qualified technical experts from the CALFED agencies, the stakeholder community and the public), working with them to refine the goals, objectives and core actions developed by the CALFED Bay-Delta Program. The Restoration Coordinator will also work with CALFED agencies to coordinate ecosystem restoration efforts within those agencies via the Ecosystem Roundtable.

Program's objectives and activities. The Restoration Coordinator will:

- ▶ Develop restoration strategies and work plans based on overall ecosystem objectives, developed with the CALFED Bay-Delta Program through a consultative process with the workgroups.
- ▶ Prepare an annual work program developed in collaboration with the work groups for consideration by the Ecosystem Roundtable and CALFED.
- ▶ Establish a workgroup process that incorporates stakeholders, agency staff and members of the public who have specific technical expertise on ecosystem restoration.
- ▶ Develop a framework for coordination of current agency funding sources with the assistance of the agency contacts for each funding source.
- ▶ Ensure that each proposal developed is evaluated to determine proper implementation,

success, and effectiveness. In addition, work with large scale monitoring efforts to adaptively evaluate and refine the overall restoration strategy.

- ▶ Develop a system to track restoration funding sources including grants, agency programs, and other sources.
- ▶ Develop a system to track ecosystem restoration efforts through the implementation phase.

**WHO MAY APPLY:** Applicants must possess broad and relevant experience in environmental restoration and the management of environmental restoration programs. Preference will be given to candidates with experience in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta and/or the Central Valley watershed.
