

**Directives to CALFED from Governor Davis and Secretary Babbitt
November 23, 1999**

1. Framework for an Environmental Water Account, which will provide more flexible water project operations to restore fisheries and meet competing demands for water from the Delta. (Press release)
2. Framework for an Integrated Storage Investigation, which will evaluate the role of surface and groundwater storage in providing more reliable supplies. (Press release)
3. Continue developing comprehensive programs on ecosystem restoration, water use efficiency, water marketing and transfers, drinking water quality, watershed and flood plain management, and South Delta water management improvements. (Press release)
4. Commitment that project operations and regulatory actions will be coordinated through the CALFED Program and that conflicts will be elevated promptly to the state and federal leadership team before an action is taken. (Davis letter)
5. Actions to reduce conflicts when the federal Trinity River and b(2) provisions of the CVPIA are implemented. These include early implementation of projects to improve water supply reliability, including the South Delta improvements program, conjunctive use projects, and water transfers and water use efficiency programs, and coordination of their implementation with appropriate state agencies and CALFED. 6. Re-authorization of the Bay-Delta Environmental Enhancement and Water Security Act. (Davis letter)
