




## Memorandum

Subject: Summary of March 22 meeting outcomes  
Calendar of weekly meetings, March 30-May 25, 1999

This memo summarizes the status or outcomes from issues discussed at this morning's Federal-State Small Group meeting.

### Facilitating Federal Contract Obligations

David Cottingham provided a short status report on efforts on the federal side to expedite the signing of contracts for federal appropriations which have already been made. He was scheduled to meet all day today with each federal agency to expedite the contracting process. Also included in these sessions were Wendy Halverson-Martin of CALFED and Susan Ramos, Chuck Wiebe and Nan Yoder of the Bureau of Reclamation.

### FY 2001 Federal Budget

David Cottingham and Mike Spear discussed the different approaches to CALFED budgeting of the Water and Power Subcommittee (overseeing Bureau of Reclamation budgeting) on the one hand and the Interior Subcommittee (overseeing Fish and Wildlife Service budgeting) on the other.

Mike expressed the desire to see an effort at the Secretarial level to communicate with the Interior Subcommittee on this, to make it clear that it is the Department of the Interior's policy to distribute CALFED expenditures across the federal CALFED agencies.

### South Delta Improvements

#### Barrier Study--

Study group will have options developed by Friday, March 26.  
Stein Buer committed to a full review of the practicability of the non-barrier approach.

*Next steps:* This issue will be before the Policy Group for a decision on May 15. Small Group will meet weekly, and this issue will be brought back to the Small Group for weekly progress reports. Progress report will be provided at the next Small Group meeting on March 30.

*Tracy Fish Screen Program--*

Mike Spear reported that the fisheries agencies and EPA are preparing a position paper outlining concerns about the technical drawbacks of screening Tracy and the implications of committing monies to this project rather than other ecosystem restoration projects.

Mike also pointed out that they will probably also conclude that Tracy needs to be considered in the context of all the proposed South Delta improvements, and therefore will not be brought forward separately to the Policy Group at their meeting on April 15th.

*Outcome:* Mike Spear and Jim Lecky supported the Bureau's proceeding with a proposal for funding to pursue further feasibility study. Kirk Rodgers stated that the proposal will integrate the concerns raised by the fisheries agencies.

*Next steps:* Progress report at the next Small Group meeting on March 30.

**VAMP**

*Outcome:* CALFED supports implementation of VAMP as described in the March 15 letter to Assemblyman Machado.

**EIR Schedule**

*Outcome:* Group agreed to meet **weekly** on Tuesday mornings through May in order to ensure that they will have the opportunity to review and approve each of the CALFED program plans, as well as address the several critical policy issues and program components which will require Policy Group approval.

*Outcome:* Group agreed to review and be prepared with comments at the next Small Group meeting on March 30.
