The Bay-Delta, an intricate web of waterways created at the junction of the San Francisco Bay and the Sacramento and San Joaquin rivers, is a critically important part of California's natural environment and economy. It supplies drinking water for more than 22 million Californians, irrigation water for more than four million acres of the world's most productive farmland, and supports 120 fish and wildlife species; some found nowhere else on the planet.


The CALFED Bay-Delta Program was initiated in 1995 by Governor Pete Wilson and the Clinton Administration to address the environmental and water management issues associated with the Bay-Delta. In January, CALFED will release its draft preferred alternative for a Bay-Delta solution.
