**CALFED HOLDS ORIENTATION SESSION**

SACRAMENTO -- The CALFED Bay-Delta Program will hold a comprehensive orientation session for its recently released draft programmatic Environmental Impact Statement/ Environmental Impact Report Friday, April 3, from 9 a.m. to noon, at the Sacramento Convention Center, 1400 J Street, room 203. CALFED staff will review the various sections contained in the environmental document and its appendices. They will also discuss the decision-making process for choosing a preferred alternative and how public comments will be incorporated into the final programmatic EIS/EIR. The session will allow ample time for questions and answers and is intended to help interested members of the public participate in the public review process. It is not a public hearing. It is free and open to the public. No registration is required

The CALFED Bay-Delta Program was initiated in 1995 by Governor Pete Wilson and the Clinton Administration to address the environmental and water management issues associated with the Bay-Delta system, an intricate web of waterways created at the junction of the San Francisco Bay and the Sacramento and San Joaquin rivers.
