Subject: Scope of Work for Program Products to be Produced by the U.S. F&WS

Dear Mr. <sup>Joel</sup>Medlin:

As a follow-up to our recent meeting on this subject, we have developed the following categories of work products based on our discussions, which we anticipate requesting from the U.S. F & WS during FFY 98. Please consider this a draft proposal and I encourage you to add categories which we may have missed. Once we agree on the categories, we will prepare more definitive scopes of work for each category.

Categories of Program Products to be produced by US F & WS

1. Habitat Conservation Plan
  - Coordinate and Manage consultant preparation of HCP/NCCP/Section 7 Consultation
  - Coordinate the joint Federal/State roles in technical oversight of the HCP/NCCP/Section 7 preparation/consultation
2. Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act
  - Participate on Impact Analysis Teams (Fisheries, Wildlife and Plants, Levee, Levee/Habitat, Water Quality, Ecosystem Restoration)
  - Prepare Coordination Act Letter
3. Preferred Alternative
  - Work with the Interagency Development Team to craft a Preferred Alternative (PA)
  - Assist in the analysis of the PA, advise on modeling assumptions.


