Congratulations. Your CALFED Ecosystem Restoration Proposal, Inundation of a Section of the Yolo Bypass to Restore Sacramento Splittail and Support a Suite of other Anadromous and Native Species in Dry Years (Proposal Number 99-B-189), has been conditionally approved for funding in the amount of \$820,679.

A cooperative agreement to fund your proposal will be prepared, executed and administered by the Army Corps of Engineers (COE). A COE representative will contact you within the next two weeks to begin preparing the scope of work and standard terms and conditions for your proposed cooperative agreement. Enclosed is the suggested information to be included in each of these items.

Upon review of your proposal submitted in response to the CALFED Bay-Delta Program February 1999 Proposal Solicitation, we noticed that we do not have original versions of the required Federal standard forms, only copies. Before the Federal Government provides funds under cooperative agreements, Federal Regulations require the proposed recipient complete and submit certain prescribed standard forms. These standard forms were included in the PSP under Attachment E and referenced as a proposal requirement on page 41. These forms are also available through the Internet at www.whitehouse.gov/omb/grants/. For your convenience, we are enclosing copies of the following three forms, along with copies of the forms you submitted:

- SF-424 Application for Federal Assistance (2 pages)
- SF-424A Budget Information-Non-Construction Programs (4 pages)
- SF-424B Assurance--Non-Construction Programs (2 pages)

The enclosed forms must be completed and submitted to the COE, 1325 K Street, Suite 1320, Sacramento, CA 95814-2922, Attention: Teresa Pacheco, within 10 working days of the signed receipt for this letter. Failure to submit these standard forms by the deadline stated indicates non-responsiveness on your part and as such funding for your proposal will be rescinded.

Your contract with COE will contain the requirements listed in the February 99 PSP (enclosed). These include:

- Project proponent commences work only after a funding agreement has been signed;
- Project proponent is responsible for ensuring compliance with all applicable laws and regulations including the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), and other environmental permitting requirements, and will submit copies of all environmental compliance documents and permits;
- Project proponent prepares a plan indicating how the public, adjoining property owners and local governments will be informed or be allowed to participate in the project planning and development and permits;
- Project proponent develops a CALFED-approved Project Monitoring/Methods Plan, in order to show progress toward the intended ecological/biological objectives and to provide input to the adaptive management process of the CALFED Program. This plan must be developed before beginning any monitoring;
- Project proponent may be required to make oral presentations at annual review meetings;
- Project proponent submits quarterly progress reports on time and complete;
- Project proponent furnishes proof of the availability of cost sharing funds (if CALFED is funding only a portion of the project); and
- Project proponent submits a final report at the end of the project.

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Failure to comply with these requirements in a timely and responsive manner may jeopardize funding of your project. COE, based on recommendation from CALFED, reserves the right to withdraw funding or withhold payment on the Agreement based on failure to comply with disclosed requirements in a timely and responsive manner.

The California Department of Fish and Game's (CDFG) Central Valley Bay-Delta Branch is available to you with identification of project requirements, information on processing permit applications or environmental documentation, determination of readiness of applications, and facilitation of resolution to problems related to permits or environmental documentation.
