For many years I have been concerned about the environment as it affects the physical and mental health of people, and about preserving and restoring clean air, clean water and healthy soil.

I am writing to encourage you to support a long-term plan for the use, conservation, and restoration of California's surface and ground water - a plan which avoids building new dams and reservoirs, which looks at major sources of pollution and ways of preventing such pollution, and which encourages all efforts to restore our rivers, streams and fisheries.

As I learned from reading Cadillac Desert, water has been perhaps *the* major issue in the modern history of California. Thank you for giving your consideration and time to this important matter.


