

ADRO Environmental, Inc., strongly supports the EWC/CUWA plan for conservation certification, particularly the following elements:
Environmental benefits and costs should be part of the definition of cost-effectiveness and therefore part of any implementation review analysis. More work is needed on this element, but it should be dealt with at the outset, not later.

Wholesalers in tier one should be given special encouragement to help retailers and other wholesalers to implement the Best Management Practices for conservation.
Non-profit organizations should have the right to appeal certification of a conservation plan. This is an unlikely event, but it provides an essential assurance to all that in a worst case scenario, there is recourse within the system.

The system for addressing suppliers found out of compliance is fair and should be supported. If a supplier is out of compliance for five years or more, it is reasonable that their rights to CalFed water supply benefits should be jeopardized. This is the ultimate stick, and it should remain in place.

Thank you for placing a high priority on water efficiency. We look forward to helping CalFed and the water agencies make this a success.
