

## **Final comments for the CALFED EIR/EIS Cumulative Impacts Section**

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There are a number of other projects in various stages of planning and development that should be included in the cumulative impact section, because of their potential impacts to water quality. DWR O&M and the MWQI Program has begun to take an active role in commenting on the inadequacies of some of these various projects in addressing drinking water quality concerns. This is of a particular concern because a large number of these projects are located in the South Delta/Old River area. They are:

1. City of Tracy - Wastewater -Currently discharges to Old River. They forecast an increase of discharge from 9 to 15 mgd in the near future, with expansion to 32.5 mgd projected for year 2012.
2. City of Tracy - Stormwater - Westside channel outfall system - expanded storm water discharges to Old River.

3. Mountain House Project - Planned discharges to Old River, near City Of Tracy's discharges. Large housing development, marina, wastewater treatment plant.

4. Discovery Bay -Byron Tract -Recently switched over to UVA treatment of wastewater. Planned future expansion of treatment plant and increased discharges to Old River.
5. Gold Rush City - City Of Lathrop - Huge planned community, marinas, golf courses, and amusement park. Adjacent to the San Joaquin River.
6. City of Stockton. - Information not clear on whether Stockton plans to divert water for municipal use or increase wastewater discharge. No contact person known.
7. Barker Slough Watershed Management Project (Solano County Water Agency). Recently received grant to begin watershed BMP implementation to improve water quality in Barker Slough.
8. Sacramento Regional POTW - Planned future increases of wastewater to the Sacramento River.
