


These interactive games will assist in developing a future adult stewardship of planet earth's most precious resource and begin to establish life-long positive water saving habits.

The ability for students to link to the Sally-Save-Water Web Site will allow the unique opportunity for interactive learning about water awareness through various integrated games. The Sally-Save-Water Web Site linkage has the ability to stand alone as a water awareness learning tool or be complementary to other environmental curricula.

Participation

Does the project include the participation of a variety of partnerships?

The establishment of Sally-Save-Water Web Site links can be done initially through Cal-Fed funding. Continued funding could occur through corporate sponsorship with a public/private agreement with the schools. Logo icons of the corporate, city, state, federal donor could be recognized in the school computer lab site.

Is it community based and does it foster collaborative efforts among multiple locations?

Yes, this does as it allows any city, bank, law firm, grocery store, etc. (corporate community sponsor) to participate in an environmental educational program that educates the current and future caretakers of our water supply.

How does the project address the local needs and concerns of the people served by the project?

The Sally-Save-Water Web Site would allow all primary and intermediate students utilizing school computers to access the water conservation and pollution prevention games. In turn, this will provide knowledge that children will impart to their friends and families, beginning to change water wasting and water polluting habits. This certainly will assist the people of the community.

Project Contribution

How does the project contribute to on-going local watershed management, resource stewardship or restoration programs?

The Sally-Save-Water Web Site will raise the consciousness of water awareness to children who are at an age where many are very interested in being "good planet earth helpers." This is the beginning of a life-long learning about resource stewardship. It will act as a complement to any existing community restoration program.

Does it encourage volunteer participation?

Yes, it makes children anxious to be good Sally-Save-Water© helpers, and children ask mom and dad to help save planet earth's water.

Ecological and Biological Benefits

Does the project stress an ecosystem approach and address multiple ecosystem issues?

The Sally-Save-Water Awareness Programs© stress the fact that we must take care of planet earth's water because we must share it with every living thing. Children will learn from new pages created for the web site about this fact. Currently, the issues of water conservation and water pollution prevention are stressed.

The multiple ecosystem discussion which is currently stressed in Sally-Save-Water personal appearances added to the current web site curricula.

Awareness and Understanding

Does the project create an awareness and understanding of natural resource issues that will lead to informed decisions and responsible actions?

Definitely, whenever public awareness is raised through positive educational effort this ultimately leads people to make better and more responsible decisions relating to their actions.

Does the project promote critical thinking skills that enable people to recognize the complexity of resource issues and make choices within social, political, scientific and economic realities?

The Sally-Save-Water Web Site interactive games allow students to begin to utilize their critical thinking skills. The remaining issues can be implemented by teachers in a grade appropriate manner through integrated curricula.

Provide for Ongoing Implementation

What is the ability of the project to leverage other funding sources and institutional mechanisms to ensure on-going implementation?

Diana Lowery Consulting which is the sole creator and owner of all the copywritten Sally-Save-Water© components will act as a consultant to schools suggesting a means in which they could continue the Sally-Save-Water Web Site linkages after two years.

Monitoring

Does the project have established mechanisms for measuring results?

Yes, the website server has the ability to monitor the amounts of contacts (hits) to the Sally-Save-Water Web Site along with the location of the city, school and teacher that is contacting the site. Children who e-mail Sally-Save-Water© are only asked to use their first name. In this way, children also learn to use safe Internet habits.
