As a PM I, in the Strategic Planning Office, you would help our team assure that implementing agencies' projects meet the objectives and policies of the Bay-Delta Program and also assist in program planning for the Delta Conservancy.

DUTIES INCLUDE BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO:

- Assist and monitor State, federal, local agencies, and other entities carrying out Bay-Delta Program implementation projects. Lead other staff in development of the program plan and policies for the Delta Conservancy. Prepare guidance, reports, correspondence, and other documents. Attend meetings and provide information to public agencies, stakeholders, and the public. Track and coordinate the modification of timelines and activities deemed necessary by the Bay-Delta Program.
- Assure that environmental resources, policies and goals are considered and incorporated into these projects in accordance with the Bay-Delta Program's Record of Decision (ROD) for the Programmatic EIS/EIR and State and federal laws, regulations, and policies. Oversee and manage contract fund use, progress on deliverables and prepare quarterly progress reports for federal grants and contracts in support of the Bay-Delta Program.

QUALIFICATIONS INCLUDE BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO:

- Knowledge of scientific disciplines related to water resource management, such as fisheries, hydrology, climate change science, terrestrial ecology, or landscape ecology.
- Ability to compile, analyze and integrate scientific information across disciplines.
- Writing skills to produce clear, accurate and concise science-related articles for a variety of audiences.
- Ability to coordinate across agencies to promote science-based adaptive management.
- B.S. or advanced degree in biological, chemical, physical, or environmental science, or closely-related scientific discipline.
