

SOLICITATION NOTICE

2008 CALFED WATER QUALITY GRANT PROGRAM CONCEPT PROPOSAL APPLICATIONS ARE DUE BY 5:00 P.M. ON THURSDAY, JULY 10, 2008

The State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board), Division of Financial Assistance is accepting applications for the 2008 CALFED Water Quality Grant Program to support projects in the Delta and its tributary watersheds to reduce concentrations and loads of certain drinking water constituents of concern.

Project Eligibility

The purpose of the 2008 CALFED Water Quality Grant Program is to provide funds to projects that restore and protect the municipal and domestic supply beneficial uses of water in the Delta and its tributaries through source control of one or more of the Program's drinking water quality pollutants of concern (organic carbon, bromide, salinity, nutrients, and pathogens).

It is critical that you contact the CALFED, State Water Board or Regional Water Quality Control Board representative as you develop your proposal to ensure it meets eligibility requirements and the program preferences and priorities.

Funding Available

Approximately \$4.2 Million is available for this solicitation with a minimum grant amount of \$250,000 and a maximum grant amount of \$4.2 Million per project. A minimum match of 25% is required, but may be waived or reduced for projects that directly benefit a disadvantaged community.

Eligible Applicants

Eligible applicants include local public agencies, public agencies, public colleges, 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations, Indian tribes, federal and state agencies.

Program Guidelines

Unless otherwise specified here or elsewhere in the application instructions, this solicitation uses the guidelines established in the 2005-06 Consolidated Grants Program Guidelines (*Guidelines*) for the Integrated Watershed Management Program (IWMP) which are available on-line at the State Water Board's website at:

Program Preferences

The 2008 CALFED Water Quality Grant Program is seeking to fund one or more projects that implement an intensive program of management practice or pollution control technology in a watershed of the Delta or one of its tributaries. Projects should be implemented at a watershed scale where water quality improvements can be measured and demonstrated. Similar projects in the past have generally been implemented in watersheds less than 200 square miles in size. Proposals most likely to receive funding must successfully demonstrate the following:

- Well planned and designed implementation activities that have a high likelihood of contributing to the desired water quality improvements based on available information;
- Significant pollutant load reductions for one or more drinking water constituents of concern as a primary purpose of the project;
- Provide multiple benefits including reduction of aquatic toxicity;
- Consistency with existing water management plans including the efficient use of water for municipal, industrial, agricultural, and environmental purposes.

Based on past studies and projects, the most competitive projects are likely to be located in the San Joaquin Valley floor, the Sacramento Valley floor, or the Delta but may include adjacent foothill areas.

Solicitation Process

The 2008 CALFED Water Quality Grant Program will use the procedures established by the State Water Board in the *Guidelines* to solicit applications, evaluate proposals, and award grants.

The Solicitation will be a two-step process. In the first step, applicants will submit brief Concept Proposals using the State Water Board’s on-line Financial Assistance Application Submittal Tool (FAAST). Applicants with the highest-ranking Concept Proposals will be invited to submit a Full Proposal. After a thorough review of all full proposals, a recommended funding list will be developed and presented at a State Water Board meeting for public comment and adoption.

All applicants requesting funds from the 2008 CALFED Water Quality Grant Program must submit a complete electronic Concept Proposal by **5:00 pm on Thursday, July 10, 2008** using the State Water Board’s online Financial Assistance Application Submittal Tool (FAAST) system at <https://faast.waterboards.ca.gov>. **Late applications will not be accepted.**

To be considered complete, the submitted Concept Proposal application must include all of the items in the checklist below. Applicants should use this checklist to verify all required information is submitted using the FAAST.
